Auburn Lake Trails has been proactive in taking mitigation efforts to avoid catastrophic fires within the 2,800 acres (1,050 homes) over the last 12 years.

Those efforts are summarized below.

- 1. Auburn Lake Trails Fire Safety & Improvement Council (ALT FSIC) was established as a 501 (c3) corporation September 2005, to promote fire safety in the Association property.
- 2. ALT FSIC established a Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP) in 2005 in conjunction with and approved by Cal Fire and El Dorado County fire districts.
- 3. CWPP's have been updated to current status and signed off by the El Dorado County Supervisor.
- 4. Auburn Lake Trails received the 5th Fire Wise rating in the State of CA in 2005. We have received this rating for the last 13 years.
- 5. ALT FSIC has received and executed \$541,755 of Federal, State & County Grants. These grants resulted in the construction of a 150-foot-wide 8-mile-long Perimeter Shaded Fuel Break (PSFB) along the Associations Northern border with BLM land.
- 6. ALT FSIC has another \$200,000 in USFS and Cal Fire grants to finish the last of the PSFB identified in our current Community Wildfire Protection Plan.
- 7. ALT FSIC has a \$200,000 dead or dying tree removal grant from Cal Fire.
- 8. Auburn Lake Trails inspects all lots in the community every year since 2005 to verify that each property meets the State of California 100-foot defensible space requirements mandated by order Government Code 51182.
- 9. Auburn Lake Trails members provided in-kind matching funds to each of the identified grants we received. This amounts to a minimum of \$541,755.
- 10. In total to date these grant funds combined with member in-kind activities equate to the spending of \$1,082,000 on 2,800 acres or approximately \$400/per acre of fire mitigation efforts and in the process of expending another \$140/acre this year (2018).
- 11. ALT FSIC publishes a column in the Associations monthly newsletter dedicated to fire safety.
